CONTINUOUS PERFORMANCE TEST

Dear Parent,

You child, _____ is scheduled for a Continuous Performance Test, on _____ at _____ am/pm which is considered to be an objective office test of attention span, impulsivity and frustration tolerance. While no single test or piece of information can make or disprove the diagnosis of Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder or measure medication response, it is considered a valuable piece of information to answer these questions. This test has been used successfully with thousands of children and most find it enjoyable.

The testing itself takes approximately thirty minutes. It includes three parts and is set up to be like a game. A technician will stay with your child throughout the testing and parents are asked to remain in the waiting room (*currently your car*) while your child is being tested.

Unless your doctor orders otherwise, all medicines your child takes should be taken at their usual times, except for the stimulant Ritalin (methylphenidate), Dexedrine or Dextrostat (dextroamphetamine) or Adderall. Please time these medications to be taken an hour to an hour and a half before the test starting time unless directed by Dr. Weckstein. Concerta, Metadate CD and Dexedrine CR Spansules should be taken at their usual time.

Also enclosed is a questionnaire for you to complete prior to the testing. **PLEASE BRING THESE FORMS WITH YOU AT THE TESTING TIME.**

Please write down on this form the date of the test the dose and time of all medications, vitamins or nutritional supplements your child takes.
